### Bible Study cake

1 cup	Judges 5 verse 25	
2 cups	Jeremiah 6 verse 20 (spice= sugar)	
2 teaspoons	1 Samuel 14 verse 25	
3 large	Jeremiah 17 verse 11	
2 cups	1 Samuel 30 verse 12a	
1 cup	Nahum 3 verse 12 (chopped)	
2 cups	Numbers 17 verse 8	
4 ½cups (plain)	1 Kings 4 verse 22	
1 teaspoon(s)	Exodus 30 verse 23 [spice c]	
1/2 teaspoon	2 Chronicles 9 verse 9 [spice n]	
1 teaspoon	Leviticus 2 verse 13	
1 teaspoon(s)	Amos 4:5 [b s] (leavened)	
3 tablespoons	Judges 4 verse 19	

Cream Judges, 1st Jeremiah and I Samuel. Beat in the 3 2nd Jeremiahs, one at a time. Add 2nd I Samuel, Nahum, and Numbers and beat again. Sift together I Kings, 2 Chronicles, Leviticus and Amos. Add to first mixture. Lastly, add Judges.

Bake at 325 °F for 1½ hours or until done.

If you do not have a bible try using the internet and simply put in the reference.

The ingredients are:- raisins, plain flour, salt, honey, butter, baking powder, milk, sugar, figs, eggs and almonds. Also Bicarbonate of soda, cinnamon and nutmeg.
