Dear Friend,

Let's listen to some eye-witness accounts from several people who met with Jesus on his way to the cross of Calvary and later on the third day when they found the tomb empty and believed his body had been stolen, until they discovered otherwise....

Meet **Hannah, a young Mum**: Oh yes I saw his magnetism for myself. Jesus just drew us all in, young and older and we all felt at home in his company. His friends seemed to be guarding him, not wanting us to tire him out – especially when we brought our children for his blessing, but he said the little ones were in God's kingdom and we should all be like them.

Here's **Bartimaeus**: I was begging there by the roadside when he was passing by. Everyone had turned out to see this Jesus of Nazareth. I was blind then, but I could sense the excitement as Jesus and his followers were coming nearer. I had heard about him – how he could make deaf people hear, and lame people walk. But could he give me sight? It was worth a try. A chance in a lifetime. I began shouting 'Jesus Son of David, have mercy on me. **JESUS. JESUS.**'

'Shut up,' the crowd yelled. Who d'you think you are? '

There was a sudden hush. What's happening? Has he heard me?

'Hey, Blind Bartimaeus. He's asking for you.' They pulled me up and led me to Him.

'What do you want?' he asked.

'Lord I want to see,'

'Receive your sight. Your faith has healed you'. Suddenly I was gazing into the smiling face of my healer. My personal miracle worker. I was laughing and crying and his hand was on my

shoulder. The crowd moved on and I could see them all. What a miracle. I'll follow him wherever he goes for the rest of my life.

Judas: I knew he was going to allow himself to be arrested. Why didn't he declare himself as the Saviour of his people, lead us all in an insurrection against Rome and restore greatness to Israel? But it was all going pear-shaped. I knew I had to force his hand or he would never fulfil his destiny as our conquering king. So I betrayed him. The sign was to be a kiss. All he said was, 'Do you betray me with a kiss, Judas?' It broke my heart.

Pilate: I always wanted to see this man. Jesus. My wife had had a dream that he was innocent of all charges, and she begged me to release him. I wanted to, believe me, but the crowd were baying for the murderer Barabbas and I was afraid of an insurrection, so I washed my hands of it and they got what they demanded - his crucifixion.

The Thief on the cross next to Jesus: He was suffering our fate, but I just knew he was innocent. In all that agony, in his death throes, he was still thinking of others. I believed he was a King, like the notice on his cross said. I asked him to remember me when he came into his kingdom, and he promised I'd be with him, that day, in the garden of Paradise. I put my trust in him.

Mary Magdalene: How could it come to this, that the Lord of Life has been crucified and buried? A great stone rolled over the mouth of the tomb, and guards outside.

We women went as dawn was breaking, with spices for the body. But imagine our shock and dismay when we found the tomb empty. We were terrified when two figures in gleaming clothes told us we should not seek the living in the place of death. **He was not dead but risen. Amazing but true!**

Do come along to this informal meal for a chat, good food and generally a laugh or two and a few jokes.



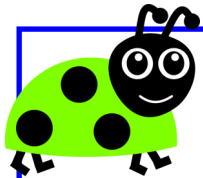

Ascension Day - Thursday 18th May 2023

Why is the Ascension important?

Ascension, in Christian belief, the ascent of Jesus Christ into heaven on the 40th day after his Resurrection (Easter being reckoned as the first day). The Feast of the Ascension ranks with Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost in the universality of its observance among Christians.



What Do People Do?

Some Christians in the United Kingdom **attend church services** on Ascension Day to celebrate this event. Prayers are made and people sing hymns at these services. Communion, also known as Eucharist, may also be offered to the congregation.

Ascension Day is observed by Catholics around the world. It is a public holiday in France, Germany, Austria, Belgium, Finland, Indonesia, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden, and Vanuatu. This day is not a public holiday in the U.K., Canada, U.S., or Australia.



Ascension Island is an isolated volcanic island, south of the Equator in the South Atlantic Ocean.



The Portuguese navigator João da Nova sighted the island on Ascension Day 1501 which fell on 21 May that year naming it *Ilha da Ascensão* after this feast day.

It is about 1,000 miles (1,600 km) from the coast of Africa and 1,400 miles (2,300 km) from the coast of South America. It is governed as part of the British Overseas Territory of Saint Helena, Ascension and Tristan da Cunha, of which the main island, Saint Helena, is around 800 miles (1,300 km) to the southeast. The territory also includes the sparsely populated Tristan da Cunha archipelago, 2,300 miles (3,700 km) to the south, about halfway to the Antarctic Circle.

Why does Easter change every year? - Sunday 9th April 2023

Each year, Easter is moveable — unlike Christmas, for example. Easter's date depends on the lunar cycle, as well as the timing of the Jewish festival of Passover, which is rooted in the Biblical account of Jesus's crucifixion and resurrection.

The Last Supper, which took place the night before Jesus was crucified, was on Passover.

The following day, Jesus was crucified and buried. He then rose again on the third day, which is when Easter Sunday now falls.

As a result of this, Easter is connected to Passover, which is in turn connected to the first full moon after the spring equinox — being held on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox.



Easter Island

The name Easter Island originated with the European explorer **Jacob Roggeveen**, who first saw the island on Easter Sunday, 1722.

Today, the Easter Islanders call themselves and their homeland Rapa Nui.

Easter Island's most dramatic claim to fame is **an array of almost 900 giant stone figures that date back many centuries called Moai**. The statues reveal their creators to be master craftsmen and engineers, and are distinctive among other stone sculptures found in Polynesian cultures.



Moai are monolithic human figures carved by the **Rapa Nui** people (**Easter Island**) in eastern Polynesia between the years 1250 and 1500. Easter Island lies 3,700km to the west of Chile! ...

S.O.S. For The Bees. Make Your Garden Bee-licious!

Top Tips for helping bees in your garden:



- * Avoid insecticides as they are bad for the bees.
- * Plant flowers that the bees love for every season, Cowslip in spring, Lavender in summer, Aster in autumn and Snowdrops in winter.
- * Go wild, plant wild flower seeds on a patch of land where you can leave them to grow and the bees to visit.
- * Keep it messy. By keeping an area of the garden where the grass grows long and the weeds flourish you are creating a bee-friendly garden.
- * Have some water with pebbles in. Bees need a drink.
- * Plant lots of flowers together, in drifts, the bees use less energy searching for their favourite food.
- * Plant some herbs, you could just have a few in a pot, or some in a window box and the bees will love you.
- * Plant fruit and vegetables for yourself but remember, first the bees will visit to pollinate and feed. It's a win-win.

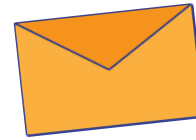
