On a day of grief I felt lifted. As I was slowly rousing myself into the day, I received a beautiful text from a dear friend: simply letting me know they were with me my wife and family today. Reminding me that we were not alone.

I then received a call from my own mother, she was fighting back tears explaining that she couldn't come to the funeral as her partner was been rushed to hospital. Her partner has been in and out of hospital for the past few years, this clearly was not good news and from her tone I sensed that she was fearing the worst.

At this point my head was pretty full and very messy: emotions running wild.

I switched on the radio.

There are two things that may be good for you to know about me.

1. I am a big fan of Nick Cave.

2. I love Desert Island discs.

On this morning of confusing thoughts and emotions as I switched on the radio, the marvelous Lauren Laverne announced that her guest this week on desert island discs was... Nick Cave. I have no words to fully describe how I felt in that moment. But I do know that I could feel God's presence keenly... it felt like a gentle nod to let me know that He was there, even as I felt I was falling into a wilderness.

In the four weeks that I have passed since that morning, I have struggled at times to feel that presence as keenly. Not because God has not been there but because the fog of life has got thicker and thicker and at times, I have found myself retreating in an attempt to seek protection from it. I suspect I am not alone in this and that each of us will have had similar experiences. If this is the case then I wonder how we then find our way back into the fullness of life? The truth unfortunately is that many people never truly do, the fog can get stronger and grow apace within them.

My mist is still there but dissipating, and it is doing so because I have been able to share my thoughts, concerns, grief and upset with others. Slowly working through the fog and confusion.

Whatever you may be facing at the moment know that you do not need to face it alone, if possible, find people to speak to and share your worries. 1623: 1st American temperance law enacted, Virginia

1853: Piano company Steinway & Sons founded by Heinrich Steinweg (later Henry Steinway) in New York City

1713: Handel's "Jubilate" first performance in a public rehearsal at St. Paul's Cathedral, London

1743: 1st US religious journal, The Christian History, published in Boston

1803: First newspaper published in Australia the Sydney Gazette and New South Wales Advertiser by government printer and ex-convict George Howe

1850: The Britannia Bridge across the Menai Strait between the Isle of Anglesey and the mainland of Wales is opened

1907: 1st radio broadcast of a musical composition aired

1933: Germany's Nazi Party wins majority in parliament (43.9%-17.2M votes)

1946: Winston Churchill's "Iron Curtain" speech in Fulton, Missouri, popularizes the term and draws attention to the division of Europe

1949: Don Bradman plays his last innings in 1st-class cricket, he scores 30

1971: "Stairway to Heaven" by Led Zeppelin first played live at Ulster Hall, Belfast
